In the imaginative Wizards Alley, all ages can enjoy familiar monsters, a fortune teller, a kooky candy store, craft booths, and a chance to get close to some of the wizard's critters. This year's Monster Maze is new and expanded, with our monsters moving into a cathedral for some scary adventures.

For adults and older children, the Museum invites the bravest of souls (not younger than 12) to venture down its hair-raising haunted trail, which opens at dark. The imaginative fright-night extravaganzas there will leave you screaming for more!

Meanwhile, the Museum will be invaded this year by aliens! You won't believe your eyes when you see what's landed on the old farmstead!

If fright makes you hungry, don't worry. There will be plenty of popular foods at the Trail Break Café to take the edge off eating all that Halloween candy. AT&T/The Real Yellow Pages will have trick-or-treat bags at the ready (but supplies are limited), and don't forget to get your glow-in-the-dark items at the Museum store or at its booth on the grounds.

The Museum will have two lines open for non-members to get the fun started as quickly as possible, and there will be a special entrance by the caboos for members and for guests who want to become members. (Please join! It's a great family value.)
